of academic patron-client relationships, and a Boasian who chose unconventional research questions and an avant-garde form of ethnography. Melville Herskovits and Margaret Mead publicly criticized her work and did not enthusiastically support her for jobs and fellowships. Anthropology was not yet ready to accept such an iconoclast, but there is much in her work that speaks to the anthropology of the twenty-first century.

Given the paucity of her material, Cole does an excellent job of setting Landes's early life in a historical context, using secondary sources on New York's Jewish Lower East Side and the cultural transformations in women's roles during the 1920s. Landes's father, Joseph Schlossberg, was secretary-treasurer of the Amalgamated

Bibliographical references are single-spaced and indented after the first line:

Lamphere, L. (2005). Out of the shadows: reclaiming the contributions of Ruth Landes [Review of the book *Ruth Landes: a life in anthropology* by Sally Cole]. *Current Anthropology*, 46, 485-6.

Parenthetical Citations in Text:

Citations are placed in the context of discussion and are formatted like so, using the author's last name and the date of publication:

(Lamphere, 2005)

Alternatively, you can integrate the citation into the sentence by means of narrative, like so

Lamphere (2005) critiques a recently written biography of an important anthropologist.
