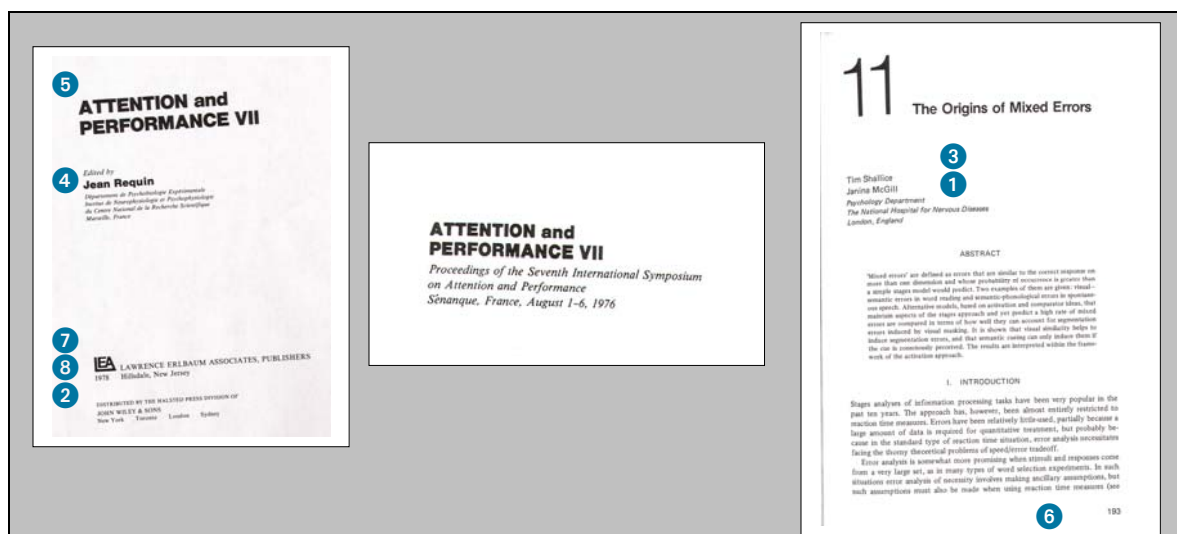

**Proper Bibliographic Reference Format:**

Bibliographic references are single-spaced and indented after the first line:

Shallice, T. & McGill, J. (1978). The Origins of mixed errors. In Requin, J. (Ed.), *Attention and performance VII* (pp. 193-208). Hillsdale, NJ: Lawrence Erlbaum.

**Parenthetical Citations in Text:**

Citations are placed in the context of discussion and are formatted like so, using the author's last name and the date of publication. Use both authors' names each time you cite the source, if there are two authors:

(Shallice & McGill, 1978)

Alternatively, you can integrate the citation into the sentence by means of narrative, like so:

Shallice and McGill (1978) address research on mixed errors.
