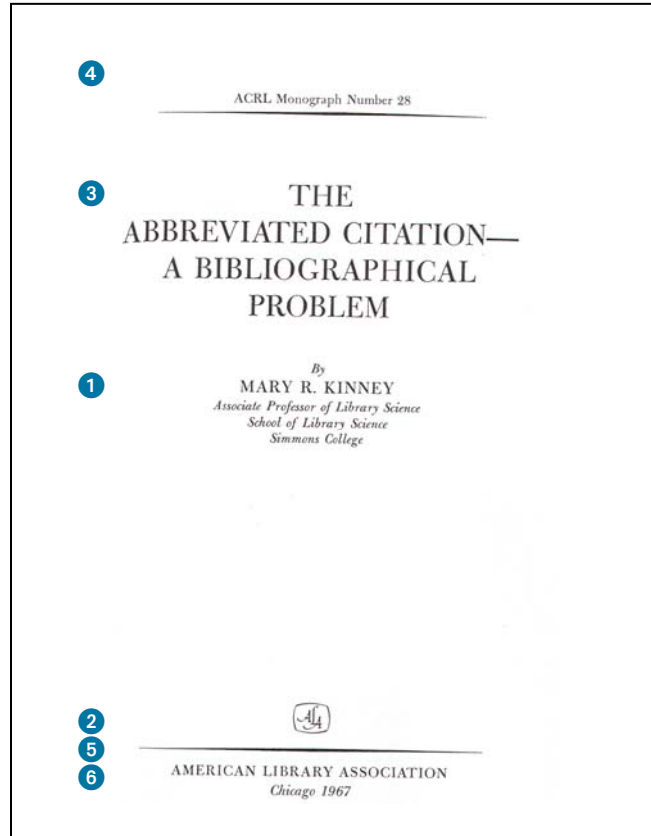


Citation Elements in order:

- ❹ **Report number:**

- ❺ **Place of publication:** Chicago
- ❻ **Publisher:** American Library Association

Proper Bibliographic Reference Format:

Bibliographic references are single-spaced and are indented after the first line:

Kinney, M. R. (1967). The Abbreviated citation--a bibliographical problem (ACRL Monograph No. 28). Chicago: American Library Association.

Parenthetical Citations in Text:

Citations are placed in the context of discussion and are formatted like so, using the author's last name and the date of publication:

(Kinney, 1967)

Alternatively, you can integrate the citation into the sentence by means of narrative, like so:

Kinney (1967) reports on the bibliographical problem threatening America's schools.
