Bibliographic references are single-spaced and indented after the first line:

Montagne, R. (Narrator). (2006, August 14). *Kim Jong-il Releases a Summer Blockbuster* [Radio broadcast episode]. In E. McDonnell (Producer), *Morning Edition*. Washington, DC: National Public Radio.

Parenthetical Citations in Text:

Citations are placed in the context of discussion and are formatted like so, using the author's last name and the date of publication:

(Montagne, 2006)

Alternatively, you can integrate the citation into the sentence by means of narrative, like so:

Montagne (2006) reported the release of a blockbuster by Kim Jong-II.
