**Proper Reference Format:**

Add the ICPSR **study number** and **date of ICPSR distribution** to the official ICPSR citation.

**Citation in Text:**

Use the normal author-date form to cite, abbreviating long corporate names for subsequent usage:

(United States Department of Labor et al. 2009; hereafter USDOL)

Subsequent references would look like this:

(USDOL 2009)
