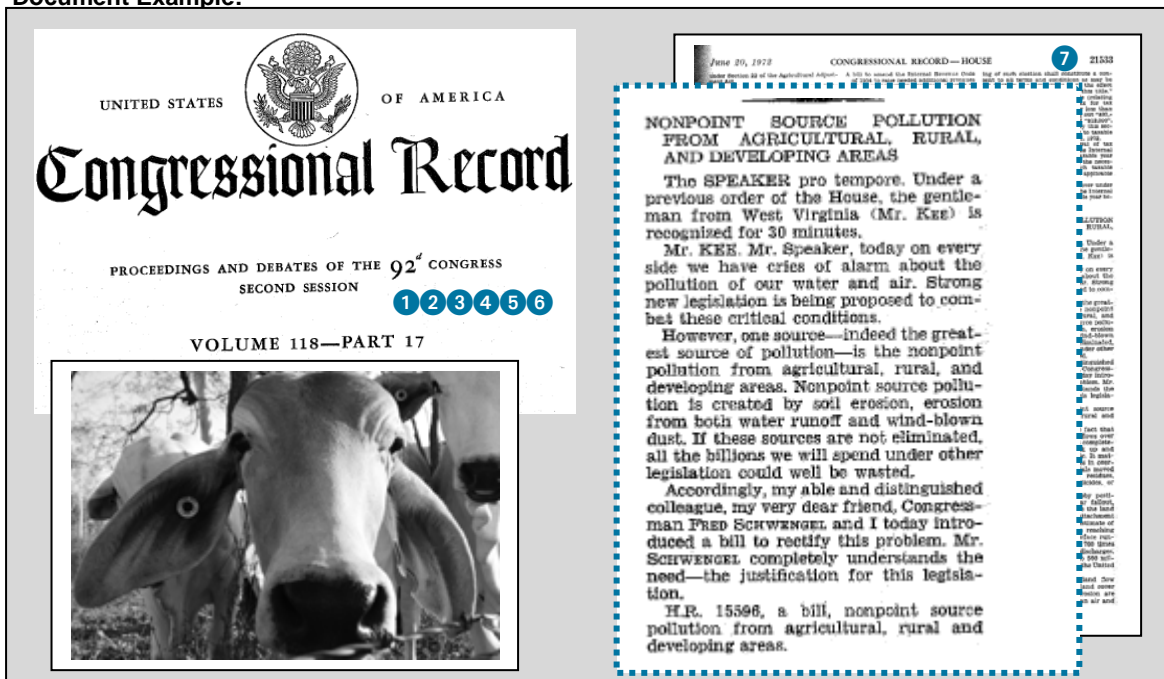


Citation Elements in order:

- ① Index title: *Congressional Record*
- ② Publication year: 1972
- ③ Number of Congress: 92nd Congress
- ④ Session of Congress: 2nd session
- ⑤ Volume of *Congressional Record*: 118
- ⑥ Part of *Congressional Record*: 17
- ⑦ Page number: 21533

Proper Reference Format:

Note that the reference is single-spaced and has a hanging indent (lines after first are indented):

Congressional Record. 1972. 92nd Cong., 2nd sess., vol. 118, pt. 17.

Citations in Text:

Use the usual author-date form for government documents. When the author is corporate and has a long name, you'll need to abbreviate that name to an acronym after the first citation. The example below also includes a page number after the date of publication:

Arkansas Representative James Kee introduced H.R. 15596 (*Congressional Record* 1972, 21533; hereafter CR), a bill that addressed the impacts of rural pollution and laid out plans for its amelioration.

A subsequent reference would look like this, with another sample page number, should it be needed:

(CR 1972, 21533)
