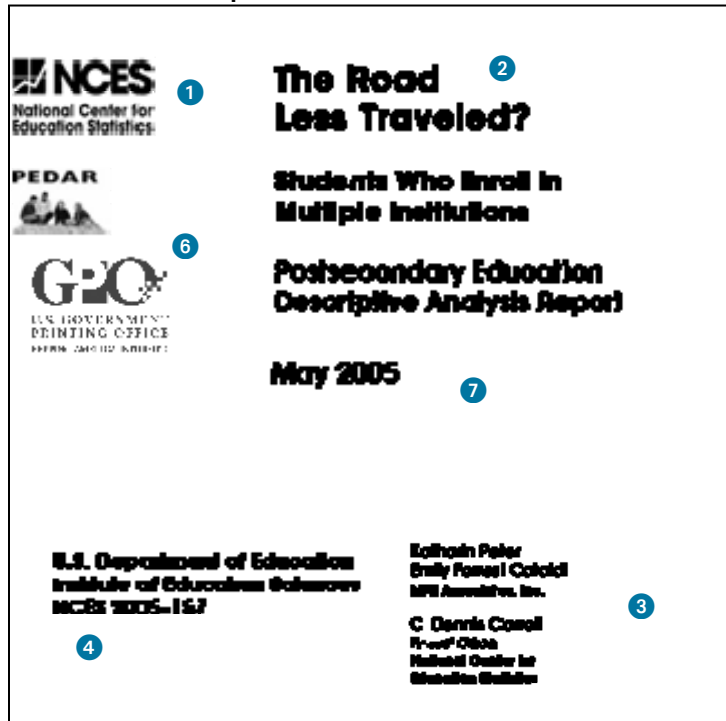

Use enough information to distinguish the item from other similar items in your bibliography. In this case, a fragment of the title will suffice, since the corporate government author is unwieldy:
