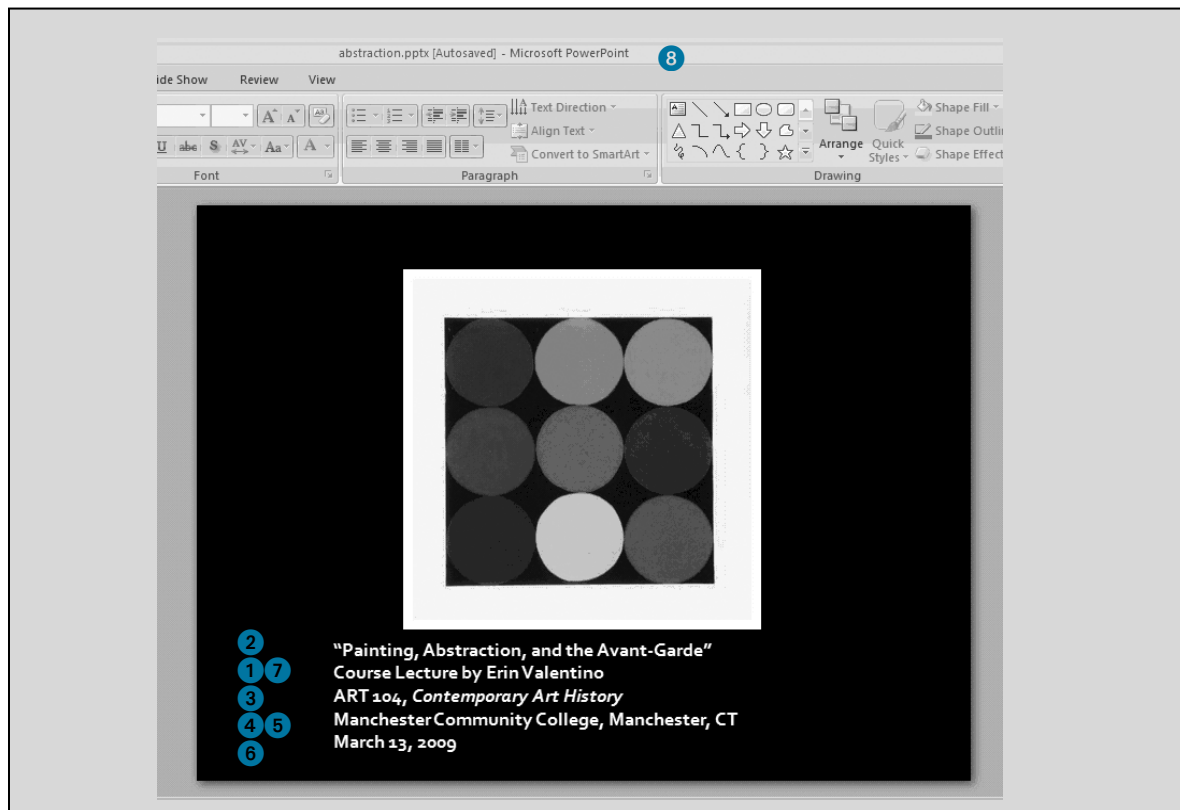

### Proper Citation Format:

### Parenthetical Reference:
